HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT has adopted a detailed written policy on racial profiling. Our policy:

- 1) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2) strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual;
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

The HONDO POLICE DEPARTMENT has satisfied the statutory data audit requirements as prescribed in Article

2.133(c), Code of Criminal Procedure during the reporting period.

Mr. Jacobs, Vice-Chair of the Medina County Central Appraisal District (CAD), addressed the Council regarding the CAD's need for a new facility. He noted that the county population has grown from 51,000 in 2020 to a projected 56,000 in 2025, with 500-800 homes being added annually. The CAD, which has operated at its current location on Avenue K since 1981, employs 11 staff members and anticipates needing at least two additional employees by 2030.

Mr. Jacobs explained that the County is informally requiring CAD to relocate. The issue has been discussed for several years but lacked urgency. CAD currently pays \$3,500 per month in rent to the County and does not have a dedicated Appraisal Review Board (ARB) room. A new facility is under contract and in the feasibility study period. Approval from $\frac{3}{4}$ of the 26 taxing entities is required. The proposed 20-year loan includes a monthly payment of \$10,000, with the City's share approximately increasing by \$1,700 annually. The total project cost is estimated at \$1.6 million, with a \$500,000 down payment.

Ms. Dixon explained that CAD funding is based on contributions from 26 entities, determined by their percentage of the total tax levy. The Mayor and Council expressed support, but no action was required at this time.

Councilman Williams moved to approve the purchase for \$75,908.29; seconded by Councilman Villa. Motion passes unanimously.

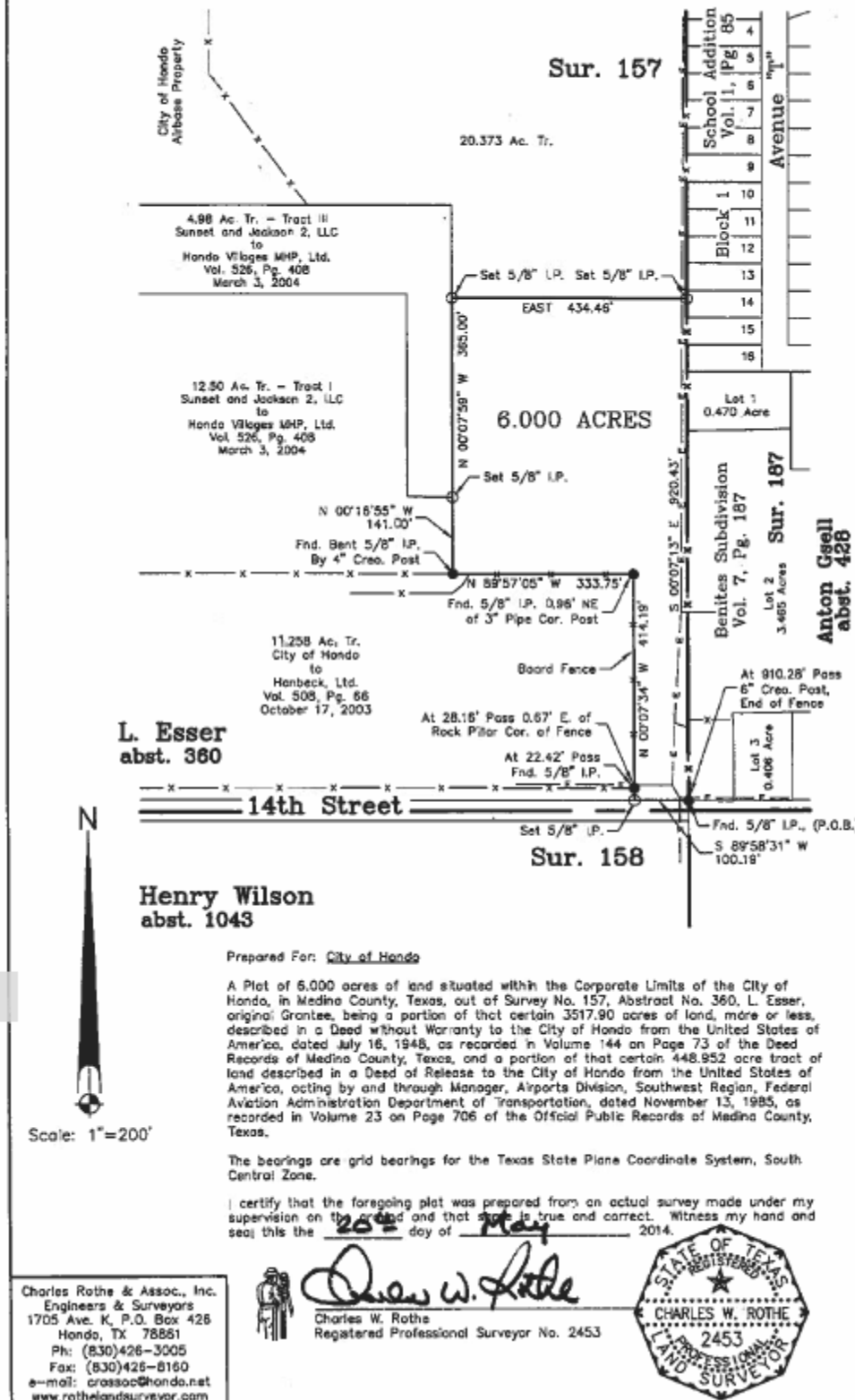

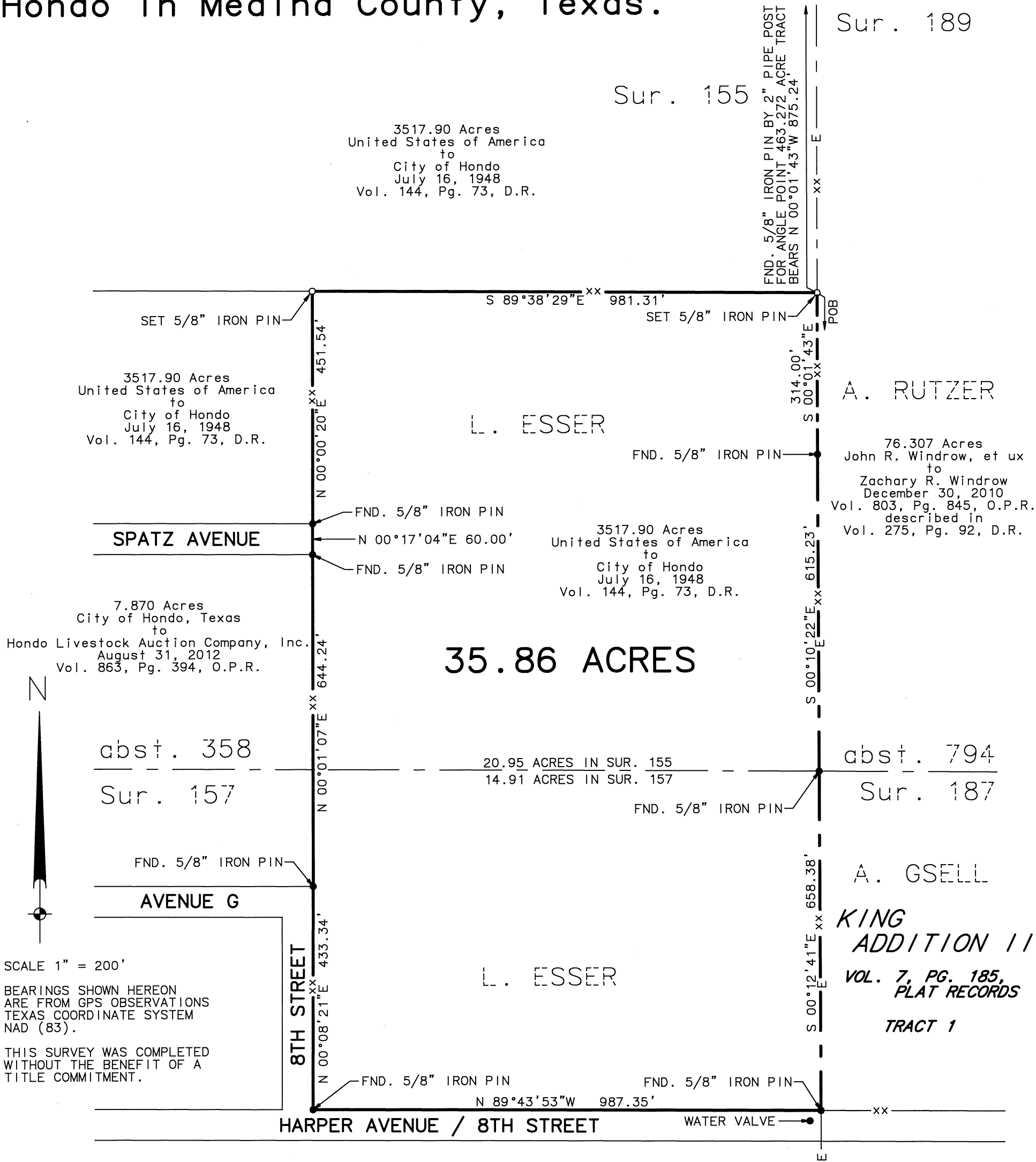
